Our gross donations came to just under \$1,700 this time. After deducting the cost of the candy and the portion that goes to the State Council for various programs including Special Olympics, our Council will be able to donate \$50 to the Wilderness On Wheels Foundation, giving us a "Donor" membership with them, and then we will equally divide up the remainder among three worthy organizations that assist our mentally and physically disabled brothers and sisters: Coffee House, the Graduate Activities Program, and Developmental Opportunities, now known as **Starpoint**. Each of them will receive approximately \$330.

Vocation Director, seminarian Brady Wagner has been provided. Brady is studying at the St. John Vianney Theological Seminary in Denver.

Christ on the Mountain Council 7640 will provide him with a Christmas Card and a check in the amount of \$250.00 The money will be taken from our restricted Refund Support Vocations Program fund. Another \$250.00 will be released in June.

Annually, through the **RSVP** program, Knights of Columbus councils, assemblies, and circles provide \$2,000,000 to the men and women studying for a life of religious vocations.

Council's fund is nearly as old as Council itself. In addition, annually each fraternal year Council advised the Supreme Council office in New Haven with the name of the seminarian, where he is studying, the amount provided, and what Council's moral and other support has been provided. Provided Council's report reaches the Supreme Council office prior to June 30<sup>th</sup>, Supreme Council will refund to every council and assembly \$100 for every \$500 provided up to a total of \$400. In the case of a Squires circle a refund of \$20 for every \$100 contributed with the minimum contribution of \$100.

### **Celebrate with Advent Wreaths**

**U**sing an Advent wreath as a focal point for your family's prayers and holiday celebrations is a great way for a family to celebrate and prepare for the birth of Jesus. An Advent Wreath is generally with leaves of laurel, spruce or similar foliage and four candles assembled equal distance from one another.

Each candle is successively lit during the weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that Christ's birth brings to the world. Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and penance, while one is rose, which signifies a break of joyful expectation on the third Sunday of Advent.

Gather your family around the Advent wreath daily, generally before the evening meal. Light the candles and pray together. At Christmas the penitential season is over and the time to rejoice is at hand! Transform the Advent wreath into a Christmas wreath. Replace the original candles with long red candles (to be lit at breakfast on Christmas morning), red ribbon and other festive decorations.

For your convenience Council 7640 will be selling not only Advent wreaths and Christmas wreaths but also Christmas cards and other religious items at Christ on the Mountain Church before and after all Masses beginning the weekend of November 27<sup>th</sup> through the weekend of December 19<sup>th</sup>.

Brother Knights, I have invested twenty-one dollars including sales tax of my own money in four #8285 McCall's vest patterns. The sizes are Medium (34-36), Large (38-40), X-Large (42-44), and XX-Large (46-48). They will require 1 ¼ to 1 ½ Yds of material to complete a garment. This pattern will work for the Council Vests and will be available for any one to come by to copy the cutting and sewing lines onto the material here at my home. I don't want to let the patterns out since they might not come back. I won't rest easy until each member of the council has a vest. I am thinking that I will take a couple of sewing class at AAA Sewing in order to make my vest. I have also just acquired my mothers sewing machine which I will use to make my vest and a lot of vests after I learn how to sew them and use the pattern. SO, order a vest by putting your name and vest size on a three by five card and drop the card in the envelope hung on the Knights of Columbus bulletin board in the basement hall way.
