### Chaplain's Corner

Dear Brother Knights,

As I'm sure you know, the Knights of Columbus grew out of a need to provide for widows and orphans of parishioners who died and left their families in dire financial straits. Fr. McGivney, the assistant at St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Ct., became aware of the problem and in October of 1881, met with 12 parishioners to outline a plan whereby employed men gave what they could to help needy families. The movement grew and on March 29, 1882, the Connecticut Legislature approved a charter for the newly formed Knights of Columbus fraternal organization. Ultimately, the Knights of Columbus Insurance program was formed thereby enabling the Brother Knights to become more active in parish life.

Born of a desire to be of service, perform charitable deeds and help those in need, the K of C has grown to almost 8,000 Councils and spread to other countries. Our Council, #7640 has over 135 members. Unfortunately, there are only 15 to 20 members who are carrying the ball.

There are limits placed on everyone, especially those with families where children with any school activities are involved. If each Knight would help with just one project during the year, the burden presently borne by a few could be lightened as more men could become active in a way that would not impair their ability to be good fathers and husbands. In fact, their participation would enable your council to offer more activities that could be family centered.

For example, the Knight's annual fish fry will be held on Fridays during Lent. Please consider helping on one Friday during this time. You'll get to know some of your Brothers as you lighten their load. You'll learn more about YOUR Council and be able to make constructive suggestions regarding other activities. Five or six Brothers could make the difference. If you will help just one Friday evening during this Lent, please call John Garbarino [303-985-9981] and find out what is involved. We are called upon to offer something extra during Lent. Why not this?

2. Call your Party's County office in March to find out where your precinct will meet, if you haven't received a written notice.

3. You can nominate your self, or a neighbor, to be a delegate to the assemblies. Bring your friends and neighbors to support you, if they are properly registered and live in your precinct.

4. You can submit written resolutions to strengthen your Party's statement of values.

Participating in your precinct caucus is not too much to ask of yourself. It only occurs once every two years!

### **Council's Cost of Assessments**

Under the heading, "*That's more information than I really wanted to know*" category is the fact that we had to pay out \$552.83 to the Supreme Council and \$995.73 to the State Council for everyone on the membership roll for 2003.

The rate was \$3.50 for Per Capita Tax and \$1.00 for Catholic Advertising Fund to Supreme. The rate was \$6.75 for Per Capita and \$0.50 for Ceremonial Degree Teams to State.

Supreme assesses per capita tax as of January 1 and July 1 annually and Catholic advertising fund April 1 and October 1 annually. State assesses both per capita tax and ceremonial degree teams January 1 and July 1 annually.

What does this *really* mean to Christ on the Mountain Council 7640? It means that as of January 1 of each year the per capita tax and ceremonial degree teams assessment must
