The meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:30 PM. The host Council provided a barbeque beef sandwich, chips, and other goodies along with a beverage of your choice.

Fourteen men attended this meeting.

The schedule of events are August 29, 2004 Provide meats and prepare same for the Parish Picnic, August 24, 2004 Council Planning Meeting at 7:00 PM at the Parish Hall, August 21, 2004 assemble at the new Parish sign to lay the building blocks for a planter around the base of the sign.

Each week of the last ten weeks four different teams are listed on a ticket and the combined score of the four teams on a particular week determine the amount of the winnings. United States Students: If you are entering your freshman year of college, considering attending a catholic college or university within the United States and are a member, child of a member,

wife of a member or a Columbian Squire, you should apply for a scholarship. Applications are available after October 1st of each year and are to be filed by March 1st, to be considered for the coming school year.

Canadian Students: If you are entering your first year of university, considering attending a university within Canada and are a member or child of a member, you should apply for a scholarship. Applications are available after October 1st of each year and are to be filed by May 1st, to be considered for the coming school year.

The Catholic University of America Students: Scholarships for The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, are administered by the University's Director of Financial Aid.

Mexico, Philippines and Puerto Rico Scholarships : Scholarships for students attending colleges and universities in these areas are administered by the respective jurisdiction, not by the Director of Scholarship Aid in New Haven, Connecticut. Please contact your local jurisdiction for more information.

Fellowships : A graduate program is available to teachers of persons with mental retardation. The applicant should be a member, child of a member or wife of a member.

Respect for the Flag

Resolution adopted Aug. 5, 2004, by Knights of Columbus meeting at their 122nd annual meeting in Dallas.

WHEREAS, since its creation over 200 years ago, the United States' flag has been revered by both the citizens of this Nation and the citizens around the world as the everlasting symbol of America's ideals, beliefs, and freedoms; and

WHEREAS, during our Nation's darkest times and in its longest hours, the United States' flag has flown signifying this country's dedication to perseverance, its unshakable unity, and its commitment to preserving an orderly, democratic society for its populace; and

WHEREAS, for decades, the United States Congress has consistently recognized the critical importance of protecting the United States' flag from desecration in any form whatsoever;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we, as Brother Knights, reaffirm our longstanding commitment to supporting either legislation or a constitutional amendment that would safeguard the physical and symbolic integrity of the flag; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we urge our elected representatives to support the passage of Senate Joint Resolution 4 which calls for a constitutional amendment that

LIFE PASS IT ON

ARE YOU REALLY CATHOLIC?

In 1992 almost 50 percent of Catholic registered voters helped to elect the most pro-abortion President in our nation's history; and in 1996 they helped re-elect him again! These phony Catholics seemed oblivious to Catholic doctrine which has been steadfast in condemning abortion as a great evil.

There is much in the news about how divided our nation is. Much of this division has to do with the classic battle between

good and evil. One major political Party is formally committed to supporting abortion, while the other major political Party formally recognizes the personhood of the unborn child from the moment of conception.

In Colorado we have been fortunate to have two of our Bishops taking a very public stand in defining The Church's teaching about abortion and other evils that poison our society. Archbishop Chaput played a key role in formulating the American Bishops' 2004 statement about "Catholics in Political Life." Among other things it states "Failure to protect the lives of innocent and defenseless members of the human race is to **sin** against justice." Bishop Sheridan of Colorado Springs has stated publicly that "Any Catholic politicians who advocate for abortion etc...jeopardizes their salvation"; and any Catholics who vote for these candidates "suffer the same fateful consequences."

We have been clearly instructed by our Bishops. We are now morally obligated to register and vote only for candidates who will uphold the sanctity of human life from conception until natural death.

The deadline for registering to vote in the November election is October 1. You can register in person at your County or City municipal building, or you can register by mail by calling your County election office or your political party's county office to request that a voter registration form be sent to you. Do it soon, don't put it off.
