LIFE PASS IT ON

UPDATE on M.O.M.

The "Maternity Of Mary" Homes for Mothers in Crisis has now officially been in operation for five years. They have 3 houses in Denver and the Colorado Springs area with 3 full-time housemothers, and 10 very modest older trailer type homes on subdivided land east of Colorado Springs. These are in various states of repair, and serve as transitional housing for the mothers after giving birth, residences for helpers, and a few are rented when not in use.

Since January of 2000, the maternity has helped 87 young mothers and their babies get a better start in life and many of the mothers and their babies are now Catholic, thanks to the loving care they receive. Only 4 of the mothers have lost their parental rights so far; which is an outstanding record according to social service agencies.

These dedicated women of God operate this vital ministry on a monthly budget of about \$8300.00 per month, which includes \$1400 house payments in Denver and medical expenses for mothers and babies! They have very little margin for emergencies, and would be very grateful for financial help, especially on a monthly basis, since their expenses will undoubtedly be going up as ours do. Can you help?

Those fabrics I have found are really too light weight and would require the vest to have a lining. One color is close to the original but again the weight of that fabric is too little to make a decent looking product.

I have looked at the Denim available at Denver Fabrics. This is a definite possibility if an appropriate gold color can be ordered. The Customer Service Secretary at Denver Fabrics told me that it would be possible to order full bolts but they may cost anywhere from six to twelve dollars per yard.

Five orders for a vest have been received so far. I want to provide a vest for all of you who want one because they are a excellent way to advertise our Council at all Knights of Columbus and Parish events in which we participate.
