### **Group Home Painting Project**

Nine Knights, two wives, and one daughter worked diligently Friday and Saturday August 5 and 6 trimming shrubbery, scraping off old paint, and generally preparing the Group home at 11491 W. 60<sup>th</sup> Ave. for a new coat of house paint.



Those who worked so diligently on Friday were l to r; Chuck Kelley, Connie and Virgil Ranker, Kenny Kroneberger, Elizabeth and Don Ferega, and myself taking the photo. Those who came to complete the job on Saturday were Connie and Virgil Ranker, Kenny Kroneberger, Keith Kroneberger – member of council 4844 and Kenny’s twin brother – Chuck Kelley, Ted Robinette and his daughter Eylse Robinette, Joe Simmons, Ken Krug, and again myself.

The project is calculated to have taken one hundred thirty man hours of labor to trim the shrubs and clean the area between the walls and shrubs, bag the trimmings and generally clean up for preparing the walls for painting. This required a lot of elbow grease and pressure to remove the old paint and caulking.

A base primer coat of paint was quickly applied and when that layer dried, Keith Kroneberger fired up the spray painting gear the brothers provided. The crew was hard pressed to stay ahead of Keith in taping around and covering the doors and windows and other items not to be painted with a special tape paper protection.

The house staff on duty Saturday prepared a barbecue lunch for all to enjoy which included home made potato salad, home made baked beans, baked or grilled chicken breast, Tostitos with a home made cheese sauce plus a spicy salsa. Some very tasty desert cakes were available as well as large jugs of cola and water cooled to perfection.

We estimated the cost at three thousand five hundred dollars which Starpoint did not have to spend in maintenance of one their home thus allowing that money to be used in other ways to take care of the clients. The Kroneberger brothers donated the cost of the caulking and primer paint and Starpoint will pay the cost of the house paint (\$190) which are included in the over all estimate of the project cost.
