### **Come Join Us In the Fourth Degree**

The Fourth Degree is the highest degree attainable in the K of C and with the regalia - hat, cumberbund, sword and cape - are the very visible arm of the Knights of Columbus. A sense of personal satisfaction it seems causes very few members to withdraw from the Knights at this stage. This Degree is the Patriotic degree and many activities are centered around a patriotic theme. Parades – Columbus day, Veterans Day and St Patrick's day - are one popular way of showing our patriotism. It is also known as the Social Degree and we Socialize two or three times a year and frequently participate in Corporate Communion (not at Christ On the Mountain unfortunately). Fourth Degree members are very frequently requested to participate in the rosary programs and the funerals of deceased members by their families.

The nearest Assembly is the **'Mother Seton Assembly # 1843'** that meets once a month at the "Dr. Earl C. Bach" Council #3340 home which is located at 3800 S. Windermere St. in Englewood, CO.

To join the Fourth Degree you must have been a Knight for one year and you must be a third Degree, although you do not have to have been a third Degree for one year. An initiation fee of \$65 is required and it will include your meal at the Exemplification Celebration. You will have to purchase your wife's meal (and the meal of any other guests you might invite) which usually costs \$20 to \$25 per person. You must wear a tuxedo to the Exemplification and if you do not wish to rent a tuxedo you may purchase one for about \$100 at Barry's or the Men's Warehouse.

### What is Life Insurance?

This may seem like a simple question. However, once one gets past the obvious answer-insurance on a person's life-then it gets more complicated.

Insurance is based on "the law of large numbers". It would be impossible to know the risks involved and the amount of money to charge on that risk of a single life! Gender, age, genetics, health, occupation, and hobbies all play a part in estimating when one individual person might die. However, with a large number of people, and the actuarial or historical studying of the age individuals die, insurance companies can come up with or estimate the average life span of groups of individuals and have accurate estimates of how much premium to charge for the life insurance. From there, the insurance companies can provide services to the families of those individuals who die prematurely or those who might outlive their income or savings.
