Term life insurance is temporary coverage insurance. The term temporary means that at some point in time - term insurance expires, it terminates with no maturity value. Initial premium rates for term insurance are usually very low, making it very attractive to the buyer. However, most term policies do not pay any type of dividend, therefore making all premium payments net cost. Term insurance policies come in all types of packaging - level term coverage with either level or increasing premiums; decreasing term coverage with either level or increasing premiums; increasing term coverage with either level or increasing premiums;

Many term policies are also renewable. At the end of the initial term period, the policy may be renewed - extended beyond the expiration date - usually for a significantly higher premium. Some allow for renewal at the same or a slight decrease in premium, however, the policy owner must re-qualify health-wise for the coverage at a lower premium.

Many term policies are also convertible - that is to say the policy or a certain percent of the policy can be exchanged for a cash value contract without proof of insurability or good health. The amount of insurance has already been underwritten when the term policy was purchased. Now it is being converted or exchanged for a cash value or whole life policy with a higher premium.

Uses for inexpensive term insurance are several. Examples might be to cover the mortgage on a home, high dollar short term debt or in a person's younger years, when income is lower but paying of a mortgage, raising children, and providing for college education in case of pre-mature death. These are important items to cover.

Most people are familiar with group term insurance at work. This is excellent coverage. However, don't be lulled into a false sense of security. The group term insurance is usually only there while you work for that company. Once you move, the company is sold or closes down, the coverage is gone. The next job may not provide group coverage and you may be too old or uninsurable to buy individual coverage. Never substitute group term coverage for owning your own individual coverage - whether it be term insurance or whole like insurance.

Name Tags and Vests

I have almost completed the first Vest and I wore it to the February 25th Fish Fry. The majority of the Knights who saw it said they liked it. One thought the black binding around the perimeter and arm holes was unnecessary. This is probably true since the vests made earlier do not have that feature. Adding the black binding is also additional labor that is somewhat difficult to do correctly. That option is something for the Council members to decide. Having the black binding adds \$3.60 to the overall cost of the Vest. Also, the style of the new vest doesn't quite match the earlier style exactly.

There is enough fabric remaining to make one more vest, so we will have to find and purchase a supply of material to satisfy those of you that really want to be identified with our Council at Knights of Columbus events. Since I can't afford to pay for the supplies and materials, I will have to ask you for the cost per vest up front. If you thought these were going to be free, we were all wrong. As I understand the situation, the bolt of Polyester Double Knit fabric Bright Gold color was donated to the council in its early beginning days and may have held fifteen yards which amounts to ten vests. I can account for the use of six yards of the current bolt so I conclude there was more than one bolt donated.

I am willing to put forth the effort to construct as many vest as you gentlemen want to be made. Just be ready to **Pay the Bill** so to speak. A cost estimate using different fabric choices and options is on the last page of this news letter. Be ready to make your feelings known as to your preference. Even if you don't attend meetings let me know what you think.
